

STARTING FROM SEED

The seeds of many native plants have dormancy mechanisms that protect them from germinating before killing frosts or in times of drought. In the wild, seeds lie dormant until the proper conditions for growth occur.

In cultivation, the successful gardener must become familiar with several simple pre-sowing seed treatment methods to stimulate quicker, more consistent germination.

Our seed germination codes were developed to help you successfully grow the seed we sell. Each of our 700+ species has been assigned a germination code(s) which can be found in this catalog, on our website, and directly on each seed packet.



GERMINATION CODES

No pre-treatment necessary. Seeds germinate after sowing in a warm location.

Hot water treatment: Bring water to a boil; remove from heat. Pour over seed and allow the seed to soak for 24 hours at room temp prior to planting or starting artificial stratification.

C(E) Seeds germinate after experiencing a winter season or after a period of artificial cold, moist stratification. Sow seeds outdoors in the fall to over-winter naturally and see germination the following spring, or artificially stratify seeds for the number of days in the parentheses. For more detailed instructions on artificial stratification, go to prairiemoon.com and type GERMINATION into the search bar.

Seeds are very small or need light to naturally break dormancy and germinate. Surface sow.

Seeds need a warm, moist period (summer) followed by a cold, moist period (winter). Sow seeds outdoors in spring and expect germination the following spring, one full year later. To artificially mimic this stratification process, mix seeds with damp sand. place in a labeled, sealed plastic bag and store in warm (about 80°F) location for 60–90 days. Then place in the refrigerator (33–38°F) for another 60–90 days before sowing.

Seeds have double dormancy and need a cold, moist period (winter) followed by a warm, moist period (summer) followed by a 2nd cold, **moist period.** Sow seeds outdoors in the fall and expect germination after 2 years. To artificially mimic this stratification process, follow instructions for code C for 60-90 days, then store a in warm (70 to 80°F) place for 60-90 days, followed by a 2nd cold, moist period for 60-90 days.

Seeds germinate most successfully in cool soil. Sow seeds in late fall (after hard frost) or early

Seeds need scarification: To scarify, lightly rub the seed between two sheets of sandpaper before artificial stratification.

Legume: Rhizobium Inoculum may be added. Most legume species harbor beneficial bacteria called rhizobia on their roots. Genus-specific strains of this bacterium called inoculum can aid in the fixation of atmospheric nitrogen and improve long-term health of native plant communities. Inoculum is naturallyoccurring in most soils and additional amendment is usually not needed. However, it may be necessary in low fertility soils. Genus-specific strains are available at **prairiemoon.com/** inoculum

SAND METHOD: SUITED FOR PLANTING IN ROWS SUITED FOR CELLS OR CONTAINERS



Place stratification sand into a bowl. We use a 1/3 cup fine sand to 1/8 oz seed ratio. Add water. We used 1 to 2 teaspoons of water per 1/3 cup of sand.





Mix only enough water to allow sand to form into a ball. Add your seed to the stratification sand and mix together. Our package label will indicate the suggested number of days for artificial stratification i.e. C(60) = 60 days of cold, moist conditions needed.





Refrigerate the seed mixture in a sealed plastic bag marked with start and finish dates. Check periodically so that the mixture does not dry out. If premature sprouting occurs, plant into containers and continue to grow them indoors

Once cold, moist stratification is complete, sow the seed into rows outdoors when the threat of below-freezing temps has passed.



Arrange seed in a single layer and allow al excess water to drain off.

Fold seed loosely into the coffee filter or paper towel to allow for weekly spot checks. The seed and paper should be damp but not wet.





Add a dry paper towel to your labeled resealable bag to help to maintain even moisture while pulling excessive moisture away. Do not allow the stratification medium to completely dry out or stay soggy.

Place the sealed bag in your refrigerator (not freezer) and monitor weekly, or as needed, until it is time to remove for sowing. Replace coffee filter or paper towel often; repeat from step 1. Once seed has completed the recommended stratification period, or if excessive early sprouting occurs, plant immediately.

STRATIFICATION SAND

We use fine sand as a medium to artificially stratify seed. Unlike other seed starting media, the uniform color and fine texture allows you to see your




WHAT'S IN A NAME?

We have changed the common name of our Lupine previously sold as "Wild Lupine." We are clarifying which species we offer: SUNDIAL LUPINE is Lupinus perennis subsp. perennis. This exact species is historically native and used to be prolific around the eastern perimeter of the U.S. The confusion stems from the fact that other species are often called "Wild Lupine." One particularly problematic species is Lupinus polyphullus, or Western Lupine, which is native to the west coast but has been introduced in gardens across the country. Because it is a larger, showier



plant and spreads rapidly, L. polyphullus has infiltrated the seed market as "Wild Lupine" and incorrectly as "Lupinus perennis." It has been proven to be very aggressive, especially in the Upper Midwest and Northeast regions. Beyond its ability to spread and overwinter, L. polyphullus is upsetting the balance of local wildlife in the eastern half of the U.S. – most notably for the federally endangered Karner Blue Butterfly whose only larval host is Sundial Lupine. The Western Lupine is NOT a larval host for this beloved species, despite the marketing push; according to the National Park Service, the foliage is poisonous. Any Karner Blues that mistakenly lay their eggs on this plant have doomed their caterpillars. Sadly, L. polyphyllus readily hybridizes with Sundial Lupine; the resulting plants are also inhospitable.

HOST PLANTS Host plants are essential for

supporting the larval stage of insect pollinators. Butterflies and moths are some of the more iconic creatures that metamorphose, but they don't begin life as the stunning beauties we know and love - they are hungry little caterpillars hatched from eggs. These larvae are not always pretty, and they often get a bad rap for eating or "ruining" the plants that house them. The amazing relationship between host plants and the larva they support has evolved symbiotically; native plants recover after hosting their native pollinators. So if you see curling leaves, webbing, poop, holes, and gnaw marks, know that you, too, are hosting these remarkable transformations in your garden!

Early spring is a great time to plant Eco-Grass, when it has the advantage of early-season soil moisture.

This versatile, fine-textured fescue blend establishes quickly, growing into a flowing carpet that can go unmowed - or be mowed.

Eco-Grass grows in most soil conditions, thriving in all but the shadiest and wettest settings.

The relatively deep root systems (4-9") enhance drought résistance by reducing water loss as they seek out deeper water reserves. Eco-Grass also yields big savings as a lawn alternative by eliminating or reducing the need for pesticides, fertilizers and frequent watering or mowing.

When Eco-Grass reaches about 8", it begins to form seed heads and tends to flop over, which can add an attractive naturalistic flow to landscape highlights. Once established, it is durable under moderate foot traffic. It resists invasion by filling in well, but will not encroach on neighboring plantings.

A cool-season grass blend, Eco-Grass is best planted on a prepared site from which competing species have been removed in early fall or early spring. Seeds can be hand-broadcast or distributed with a grass-seed spreader and should be lightly raked in and then watered well for the first two months, if needed. Depending upon conditions, germination can be expected in one to two weeks.



The cool-season nature of Eco-Grass shows in its bright-green luster in late autumn, followed by browning in dormancy and an early spring green-up.



GROWING YOUR PRAIRIE FROM SEED

Establishing a successful native planting from seed is a labor of love and patience. Most who have been through it will praise the process, the thrill of discovery and the absolute joy in transforming a space with little biological activity into a healthy ecosystem. You will delight in your efforts season after season as the plants and wildlife of the North American prairie become a part of your home landscape.



SITE PREP & SEEDING

The first growing season should be dedicated to site preparation, a crucial first step to a successful planting. There are several different methods to accomplish this task. After site preparation is complete, seed can be sown.



Keeping the site mowed to 4-8" during the first year of growth will control any remaining weeds, allow sunlight to reach the slowgrowing perennials, and promote strong root growth.



PIONEER FLUSH

The season after planting there will only be a few native species that flower. This stage is known as the Pioneer Flush. It can take 3-5 years after planting for most perennials to bloom for the first time.



DIVERSITY OF BLOOMS

As time goes on, more and more perennial wildflowers will start to bloom.
