
POLLINATOR POWER PACKS

STARTING FROM SEED

The seeds of many native plants have dormancy mechanisms that prevent them from germinating before killing frosts or in times of drought. In the wild, seeds lie dormant until the proper conditions for growth occur. In cultivation, the successful gardener must become familiar with several simple pre-sowing seed treatment methods to stimulate quicker, more consistent germination.

Our seed germination codes were developed to help you successfully grow the seed we sell.

Seed should be stored in a cool, dry place or an airtight container under refrigeration (33-40°F) until you are ready to plant or begin pre-sowing treatment.



Hot water treatment: Bring water to a boil; remove from heat. Pour over seed and allow the seed to soak for 24 hours at room temp prior to planting or starting artificial treatment.

Seeds germinate after sitting out over winter or after a period of cold, moist stratification. Sow seeds outdoors in the fall to over-winter naturally and see germination the following spring, or artificially stratify seeds for the number of days in the parentheses. For more detailed instructions on artificial stratification, go to prairiemoon.com and type GERMINATION into the search bar.

Seeds are very small or need light to naturally break dormancy and germinate. Surface sow.

In order to germinate, seeds need a warm, moist period (summer) followed by a cold, moist period (winter). Sow seeds outdoors in spring and expect germination the following spring, one full year later. To artificially mimic this stratification process, mix seeds with damp sand, place in a labeled, sealed plastic bag and store in warm (about 80°F) location for 60-90 days. Then place in refrigerator (33-38°F) for 60-90 days before sowing.

Seeds have double dormancy and need a cold, moist period (winter) followed by a warm, moist period (summer) followed by a 2nd cold, moist period. Sow seeds outdoors in the fall and expect germination after 2 years. To artificially mimic this stratification process, start by following instructions for code C for 60-90 days, then store a in warm (70 to 80°F) place for 60-90 days, followed by a 2nd cold, moist period for 60-90 days.

Seeds germinate most successfully in cool soil. Sow seeds in late fall (after hard frost) or early spring.

Seeds need scarification: To scarify, lightly rub between two sheets of sandpaper before artificial stratification.

egume: Rhizobium Inoculum may be added. Most legume species harbor beneficial bacteria called rhizobia on their roots. Genus-specific strains of this bacterium called inoculum can aid in the fixation of atmospheric nitrogen and improve long-term health of native plant communities. Inoculum is naturallyoccurring in most soils and additional amendment is usually not needed. However, it may be necessary in low fertility soils. Genus-specific strains are available at prairiemoon.com/inoculum

CREATE SOFT LANDINGS

Add native plants under keystone native trees (pg. 40) to create an environment that supports life cycles of countless **insects.** Many lay their eggs in the shelter of tree limbs; the young caterpillars and larvae eat their fill in the boughs - then rappel to the ground to pupate. A large percentage of these pupae overwinter in the leaf litter, plant debris, and soil.

Providing permanent plantings from tree trunk to dripline makes a "Soft Landing" for these insects to drop into. Leave the leaves to improve soil structure, remove thick mulch and landscape fabrics to allow the tree to respire, and do not

mow the understory garden. Simply sit back and enjoy the complex ecosystem on your property!



FIREFLIES: AT RISK

Whether you call them fireflies or lightning bugs, over 150 different species of these mystical beetles make their home in North America - and every single one of them is declining - threatened by several key factors: habitat loss/degradation, climate change, insecticides, and light pollution. Here are things you can do to assist these whimsical creatures:

1. Create a Space – Fireflies thrive in secluded, moist, organically rich environments. Encourage them to stay at your place by leaving a small woodpile or felled tree in the shade to decompose. Plant trees native to your area. Set aside a portion of land for a little bit of wilderness; allow a diverse mixture of grasses and flowers to grow taller than the manicured lawn. Most female fireflies send their signals from perches, blinking like little lighthouse beacons.



3. Turn Off the Lights – light pollution is easy to fix and instantly reversible. Keep outdoor lights to a minimum to allow lightning bugs optimal communications with each other. Many species of firefly use specific bioluminescent signals to find their mates. Artificial lights may distract them from their mission and certainly interferes with fervent messages. No love language? No new lightning bugs.

4. Talk to the Neighbors – the efforts you make on your property are important - but fireflies are not limited to a single plot. Get friendly with your neighbors and encourage their involvement. Together, we can bring these nostalgic little beetles back from the brink and enjoy their dazzling performances again!

Early spring is a great time to plant Eco-Grass, when it has the advantage of early-season soil moisture.

This versatile, fine-textured fescue blend establishes quickly, growing into a flowing carpet that can go unmowed - or be mowed.

Eco-Grass grows in most soil conditions, thriving in all but the shadiest and wettest settings.

The relatively deep root systems (4-9") enhance drought resistance by reducing water loss as they seek out deeper water reserves. Eco-Grass also yields big savings as a lawn alternative by eliminating or reducing the need for pesticides, fertilizers and frequent watering or mowing.

When Eco-Grass reaches about 8", it begins to form seed heads and tends to flop over, which can add an attractive naturalistic flow to landscape highlights. Once established, it is durable under moderate foot traffic. It resists invasion by filling in well, but will not encroach on neighboring plantings.

A cool-season grass blend, Eco-Grass is best planted on a prepared site from which competing species have been removed in early fall or early spring. Seeds can be hand-broadcast or distributed with a grass-seed spreader and should be lightly raked in and then watered well for the first two months, if needed. Depending upon conditions, germination can be expected in one to two weeks.

The cool-season nature of Eco-Grass shows in its bright-green luster in late autumn, followed by browning in dormancy and an early spring green-up.

GROWING YOUR PRAIRIE FROM SEED

Establishing a successful native planting from seed is a labor of love and patience. Most who have been through it will praise the process, the thrill of discovery and the absolute joy in transforming a space with little biological activity into a healthy ecosystem. You will delight in your efforts season after season as the plants and wildlife of the North American prairie become a part of your home landscape.

Year 2



SITE PREP & SEEDING

The first growing season should be dedicated to site preparation, a crucial first step to a successful planting. There are several different methods to accomplish this task. After site preparation is complete, seed can be sown.



Keeping the site mowed to 4-8" during the first year of growth will control any remaining weeds, allow sunlight to reach the slowgrowing perennials, and promote strong root growth.




PIONEER FLUSH

The season after planting there will only be a few native species that flower. This stage is known as the Pioneer Flush. It can take 3-5 years after planting for most perennials to bloom for the first time.
